Yet, the projects are united by certain visions and beliefs – that to design and build in the most environmentally progressive manner possible is both a responsibility and a potential source of poetry; that public buildings, with their stewardship of public funds, natural resources, and cultural resources provide a powerful statement about the culture to which we aspire; and that when architectural ideals confront pragmatic concerns students are presented with intense learning opportunities.
